Recommendation to schedule a Public Meeting for the Dewdney Mountain Farms Quarry zoning bylaw amendment application.

Land use planner with MHBC – President Zeman. “We were contacted because we have extensive experience in mineral aggregate applications. Retained by Trent Lakes to assist.”(Zeman)

Today’s report is to seek direction from council to schedule a public meeting.

“At the public meeting a more detailed report of the history of application, including roads and noise will be presented. A recommendation report will not be provided at that point. I will want to listen to public comments before recommendation is made.”

Subject site – 543 Ledge Road. South on Ledge Road to Quarry Road is proposed haul route. Six trucks going in and eight trucks going out in an hour is suggested truck travel. Different types of trucks with different loads or trailers.

Aercoustics conducted a noise peer review.

County found road report to be acceptable from their perspective.

Franzen asked if the spring at the corner of Ledge and Hwy 36. Will that spring be eliminated?

Zeman will report at the public meeting with an answer.

Armstrong – thanks for excellent summary thru power point. Up until last night I was assuming that we were anticipating an alternative haul route. What happened to that alternative route? I think that it is premature to have a public meeting before this is known.

Alternative route – I do know that when the initial application was submitted there were considerations to upgrade Ledge Road or the use of an unopened road allowance. Mr. Culp would be better to discuss this. Culp - We were provided a sketch which illustrated a new alignment on the unopened road allowance. It was simply a line on land. We identified two stumbling blocks – a significant unevaluated wetland and then based on contours and topography there is significant relief through which the unopened road allowance passes. Further to that we have heard nothing about that alternative.

Armstrong – Believes this is somewhat precedent setting for Trent Lakes. This is the first quarry that exits and enters on a residential road with significant population growth. Believes there are decisions around haul route and the haul route agreement that need to be made before public meeting is made.

Zeman - A draft haul agreement needs to be made before public meeting.

Armstrong – receive a status report on where all these things are at the July 12 meeting.

Franzen – would never support this haul route as I believe this would dramatically impact the lives of the people living there.

Adelle Arbour – Believes that we should go on with public meeting for input from public to help and prepare information that Armstrong requested for distribution at public meeting.

Lambshead – Motion - Council receive report from MHBC and that council directs staff to prepare for public meeting on August 10. Armstrong seconds.
