Background:

The following activities were performed by Public Works:

Surface Treatment

Surface treatment of the following has been completed:

- Elwood Crescent
- Moon Line Road North
- Six Foot Bay Road
- Kawartha Hideaway Loop
- Kawartha Hideaway Road
- Grantsville Trail
- Crystal Lake Road (County Road 121 to Transfer Station)
- Galway Road (County Road 121 to Queen’s Line)

Surface Treatment Warranty

Approximately 8km of warranty surface treatment was completed on the following roads:

- Moon Line Road
- Bass Lake Road (County Road 36 to Tully Road)
- Tate’s Bay Road
- Edwina Drive

Beaver Lake Road

The completion of Beaver Lake Road between the first and second bridge including surface treatment.

Ditching

Elbow Point Road and Harvey Lakeland Estates are complete. Buckhorn Narrows Road, Barcroft Road and Deer Bay Reach South are scheduled for this fall.

- Fall grading will be ongoing as weather permits.
- A double cut of municipal roadsides has been completed and fall brushing will commence.

Transfer Station Update

The survey and design for the Cavendish Transfer Station retaining wall is near completion and will then go to tender for repairs.
